Over the past decade there has been a proliferation of multi-stakeholder initiatives (MSIs) that bring together diverse actors from the public, private and civil society sectors to solve pressing governance challenges, such as enhancing transparency and improving accountability for better and more sustainable development outcomes.

The meeting will bring together secretariat staff and country stakeholders of leading MSIs from a range of industry sectors and at varying stages of maturity, as well as funders of MSIs and experts in multi-stakeholder processes.
